- He was born on November 16, 1922, but birth documents show that he was born two days later.
- His family escaped fraud and from paying the fine for not having registered his birth at the proper legal time.

Education Background


- Primary school:
 - In the second class he was writing with no spelling mistakes.
 - The third and fourth classes were done in a single year.
- Grammar school:
 - Stayed two years and got excellent marks in the first year.
 - Not so good in the second.
 - He was liked by classmates and teachers.
 - Was elected treasurer of the Students' Union at the age of twelve.
- Parents concluded that hey could not keep him in the grammar school, and sent him
 to a technical school so that he would make money.
- Technical School:
 - Five years he learned to be a mechanic.
 - He also learned French and took a course in a literature subject.
 - As he had no books at home and borrowed from a friend. After finishing the course, he worked for two years as a mechanic at a car repair shop.


Home

Accomplishments



Censorship/Politics

- In 1991, The Gospel According to Jesus Christ, was censored by the Portuguese government for being offensive to people of the Catholic faith.
- Moved to the island of Lanzarote in the Canaries Islands.
- Has been a member of the Portuguese Communist Party since 1969, an atheist, and a self-described pessimist.
- He tends to deliver rather dull speeches denouncing the European Union or the International Monetary Fund.
- He managed to create a worldwide scandal when, on a tour of the West Bank, in 2002, he compared the situation in the Palestinian territories with "Auschwitz."
